12 I. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE
13 Mayor White called for all to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

15 II. CALL TO ORDER
16 Mayor White called the meeting to order and established a quorum at 7:00 PM.

18 III. APPROVE MINUTES: July 17, 2007 Regular Meeting

20 Motion 1: A. Brown moved to accept the minutes of the July 17, 2007 Regular Meeting as written.

37 A. Presentation: Katelyn Lord – United Way
38 Katelyn Lord, 1140 SW Abbey in Newport, addressed the council regarding a new United Way
39 campaign that involves collaboration between agencies and civic groups. They are seeking volunteers
40 and Board members, and plan to hold meetings in Depoe Bay because of its mid-county location.

42 Onno Husing addressed the council regarding his project of creating a DVD with information regarding
43 Oregon’s ocean and fisheries status. The project has already received donations equaling about 3/4 of its
44 estimated cost of \$75,000. Mayor White indicated he preferred to discuss this with full council and staff
45 present.

6 Kay Skaggs, 416 NE Hwy 101, reported that the Cruise-In to Drive Out Hunger Car Show and Poker

8 Depoe Bay Food Pantry. Boss Radio may set up an on-location broadcast at the Whale Center, or
9 possibly at City Park, where live music will begin at 2 PM.

11 Sally Cutter, Chamber of Commerce, addressed the council regarding a “My Town Media” map. Mayor
12 White asked her to find out whether government agencies can be listed at no charge. Davilla added that
13 next Monday is the annual appreciation picnic at city park for the city council, city staff, Coast Guard,
14 and fire department.

35 Romans said Alice has been a tremendous asset to city hall.

37 Mayor White 1) Reported on the Oregon Mayors Association (OMA) meeting he went to in Salem last
38 week. The speakers were good, but subject matter was more applicable for big cities, and he would like
39 to see them schedule more speakers addressing small city issues. There were only about 50 mayors
40 present out of 240. He will be on the OMA board for another year. Next year’s conference will be in
41 Pendleton. 2) Received a *London Sunday Times* newspaper article from the Mexican Consulate that
42 states “Drake’s American Colony Found” and says if scientific tests confirm it, Whale Cove will be
43 regarded as the first outpost of the British Empire.
