17 Mayor White called the meeting to order and established a quorum at 7:02 PM.

19 III. APPROVE MINUTES: November 18, 2008 Executive Session and Regular Meeting

21 Motion 1: Leff moved to accept the minutes of the November 18, 2008 Executive Session and Regular
22 Meeting as written. Taunton seconded the motion.

24 Mayor White said it was moved and seconded, and called for discussion. There was none.

26 Vote: Motion 1 passed.

31 Motion 2: Zimmerman moved to approve accounts payable as submitted. Taunton seconded the motion.

4 A. Review Draft Animal Control Ordinance

5 Murray reported that Brenda Martin submitted three pages of information which were included in the

9 B. City Meeting Times

10 Murray said this item was a staff request to change meeting times from an evening schedule to an
11 afternoon schedule. This item was tabled until the first meeting in January.

14 A. Request to Restrict Speed Limit on Coast Avenue

15 Owings said posting signs would remind people what the speed limit is, but that enforcement of the
16 speed limit would be very difficult. (Copy of letter date stamped 11/24/08 attached to original of these
17 minutes.)

19 Motion 3: Brown moved to approve putting up speed limit signs on Coast Avenue. Cameron seconded
20 the motion.

21

22 Mayor White said it was moved and seconded, and called for discussion. It was clarified that the speed
23 limit is 20 MPH for the full length of Coast Avenue, and signs will be posted.

25 Vote: Motion 3 passed.

28 B. OLCC Liquor License Application – Renegade Brewing Company

29 The applicant was present to answer questions about his application (copy of application attached to

33 application. Zimmerman seconded the application.

35 Mayor White said it was moved and seconded, and called for discussion. There was none.

10 responded that the contractor will be working on them in January, and a railing will be installed.

12 Murray – 1) The letter of intent to apply for a grant to replace the bridge in the park that the city sent to
13 the Parks and Recreation Department has resulted in an invitation to submit an application, which is due
14 by January 9. The city planner will be preparing the application. 2) The VFW will be holding a
15 ceremony for Pearl Harbor Day on December 7 at 1 PM at the memorial in City Park.

18 Zimmerman – 1) Hopes everyone had a good Thanksgiving. 2) Said it's time for getting Christmas lights
19 out.

21 Brown – Merry Christmas and happy holidays. He's looking forward to next year.

29 December 15 is the community potluck. 3) On the subject of meeting times, sometimes people want to
30 attend a meeting, and if it's during the day, they may not be able to attend if they are at work.

33 2) Hopes everyone had a good Thanksgiving, and Merry Christmas to everyone. 3) Wants to work
