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13 I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER AND ESTABLISH A QUORUM

14 Mayor White called the meeting to order and established a quorum at 6:02 PM.

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16 II. ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

17 Motion: Zimmerman moved to approve the accounts payable as submitted. Leff seconded the motion.

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19 Mayor White said it was moved and seconded, and called for discussion. There was none.

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21 Vote: Motion passed.

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24 III. EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS TABLE TOP EXERCISE

25 Specialized personnel attending the meeting included: Depoe Bay Fire District Chief Josh Williams,
26 Lincoln County Sheriff's Office Lieutenant Landers, Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospitals
27 representative Jenny, Samaritan Depoe Bay Clinic representative Jennifer, and Michael Dane for
28 communications.

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30 Mayor White asked Jim Hawley to begin the exercise. Mr. Hawley focused on positive aspects such as
31 available resources and negative aspects such as damages, injuries, and unavailable services. In the
32 exercise scenario of a 9.0 earthquake, all the buildings would be gone, the bridge would be gone, the bay
33 area would be flooded, water and gas lines would be broken, the water tank would not be left standing,
34 electricity would be unavailable; there would be no cell phone service, no natural gas, no sewer, no
35 internet, no credit cards. There is not a stash of blankets, cots, water, medical supplies for more than one
36 week, or food. On the positive side, the fire department has a truck with 3,000 gallons of water stationed
37 in Depoe Bay, they have 20 medically-trained personnel, they have backup generators, they have radio
38 communication, there are currently 23 citizens in a CERT (Community Emergency Response Team)
39 class. Things to be considered include possible acquisition of a satellite trailer like the one Samaritan has
40 with its own generator, satellite internet service, and VOIP; identify the places where helicopters can
41 land with supplies and to evacuate injured persons. It was advised not to evacuate your home if it's in
42 good condition, and to keep a three-day supply of food and water on hand, don't stand in doorways
43 during an earthquake, and don't stay in your car during an earthquake; and it was noted that if children
44 are in school that they would be well taken care of because the schools have an emergency plan in place.

1 Kay Wyatt said she lectures on the subject of the subduction zone and would be agreeable to give the
2 council a presentation.
