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12 I. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

13 Mayor White called for all to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

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15 II. CALL TO ORDER

16 Mayor White called the meeting to order and established a quorum at 7:00 PM.

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18 III. APPROVE MINUTES: September 21, 2010 Regular Meeting and Executive Session

19 Motion 1: Davilla moved to approve the minutes from the September 21, 2010 Regular Meeting  
20 and Executive Session as written. Leff seconded the motion.

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22 Mayor White said it was moved and seconded, and called for discussion. There was none.

23  
24 Vote: Motion passed.

25 Ayes: Davilla, Leff, Brown, Zimmerman

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28 IV. ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

29 Motion 2: Zimmerman moved to accept the Accounts Payable as presented. Brown seconded the  
30 motion.

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32 Mayor White said it was moved and seconded, and called for discussion. There was none.

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34 Vote: Motion 2 passed.

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43 VII. PUBLIC COMMENTS

44 There were no public comments.

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46 VIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

47 A. City Hall Hours of Operation Revision – Noontime Closure

48 Mayor White began discussion of this item by stating his feelings on the subject. He was in favor of  
49 noontime closure, with employee safety being the primary reason. He said if citizens had concerns  
50 about the proposed closure, there would have been more than two people show up at the last  
51 meeting to share their feelings. Councilors reiterated their feelings from the previous meeting.  
52 There was discussion on an idea brought up at the previous meeting regarding an emergency exit  
53 from the office area of the building; Councilors were in agreement that this is a good idea. Owings  
54 was directed to look at options for placement of an emergency exit; due to limited space available  
55 for another door, Councilor Davilla offered to help with ideas. At Mayor White's suggestion, it was  
56 the consensus of the Council to wait to vote on this item until the full Council is present.

1 IX. NEW BUSINESS

2 A. Speeding Vehicles – Collins Street

3 Dorothy Bishop, 205 E Collins, addressed the Council regarding vehicles speeding on Collins Street.  
4 She requested additional 25 MPH signs, or moving existing signs to better locations. There was  
5 much discussion about the situation and the dangers it presents. Owings said that signs will keep  
6 the honest people honest but won't slow down speeders. Sgt. Bob Jozwiak was present and  
7 encouraged anyone witnessing speeding incidents to report them promptly, even if it's not possible  
8 to get license plate numbers.

9  
10 Maggie Brown, 15 SE Ainslee, said she'd like to see the County re-paint the white lines on Collins  
11 Street.

12  
13 Terry Wideman, 325 Cliff Street and Traffic Safety Commission (TSC) Chairman, said that Collins  
14 Street appears on the TSC agenda 2-3 times each year, and is on the agenda for their October 19  
15 meeting. The TSC believes signage is an issue.

16  
17 John O'Brien, 270 Bensell Avenue and TSC member, thought a sign near Ainslee Avenue would be  
18 helpful.

19  
20 Owings said there are two City employees who live in the area, as well as City employees going to  
21 and from the water treatment plant, and they will be asked to watch and report. Mayor White  
22 suggested the TSC invite the Sheriff's Department to the next TSC meeting.

23  
24 Brent Berry announced that he is running as a write-in candidate for Council Position #6.

25  
26 B. Bid Award – Re-Roof City Hall Storage Barn

27 Owings said one proposal was received, from Jagow & Sons. He recommended accepting their  
28 proposal.

29  
30 Motion 3: Zimmerman moved to enter into contract with Jagow & Sons to re-roof the City Hall  
31 storage barn for \$7,755. Brown seconded the motion.

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33 Mayor White said it was moved and seconded, and called for discussion. A Councilor asked about  
34 references; Owings responded that he is familiar with the company and has references.

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36 Vote: Motion 3 passed.

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39 X. CORRESPONDENCE

40 There was no correspondence.

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42 XI. CITY STAFF REPORT

43 There was no report.

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45 XII. COUNCIL COMMENTS

46 Davilla welcomed Mayor White back, and thanked interested people for coming to the meeting and  
47 sharing their concerns about the community.

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49 Zimmerman said he's a new Collins Street resident who has witnessed speeders and will collect  
50 reporting information. He felt signage would be key to getting people to slow down.

51  
52 Brown said he's been approached by the chairman of the Ocean Policy Advisory Council (OPAC) for  
53 Depoe Bay to consider celebrating the establishment of Oregon's first marine reserve off our  
54 shores, and the large role Depoe Bay played in identifying the area for the reserve. He said the  
55 Near Shore Action Team (NSAT) doesn't want to be involved because they feel it's "honking their  
56 own horn", but Brown would like the City to consider it. He reviewed a handout (copy attached to  
57 original of these minutes) outlining points in favor of a celebration. An audience member said the

1 City shouldn't shoulder the [financial] burden [of a celebration] entirely, because Lincoln County,  
2 the City of Newport, and other agencies worked together with the NSAT. It was the consensus of  
3 the Council to hold a celebration. Mayor White will attend the next OPAC meeting in Newport and  
4 get more information for the Council.

5  
6 Leff thanked everyone who came to the meeting, and said she supports Brown's idea of celebrating  
7 the City's clearly-demonstrated success at making sure the needs of the local economy are  
8 balanced with the need to keep the ocean whole. She also thanked those who attended Candidates'  
9 Night at the Spouting Horn.

10  
11 Mayor White 1) Reviewed agenda items and activities from the League of Oregon Cities conference  
12 he recently attended in Eugene. He thanked the Council for allowing him to attend these  
13 conferences and mingle with other jurisdictions. 2) Thanked everyone for attending. 3) Wished Mr.  
14 Berry luck with his write-in campaign. 4) Thanked the Council and Staff for their hard work.

17 There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:53 PM.
