49 <u>Jack Chiavarrio</u> 4210 NE Hwy 101 Lincoln Beach addressed the Council regarding the

- 50 contentiousness at the last Wastewater Advisory Committee meeting, and he thought an apology
- was in order. He said he was speaking for himself, not for the Gleneden Sanitary District Board.
- 52 Out of concern for the people he serves in the Gleneden area, he thought the Council and the
- 53 sewer district users could probably benefit from a much closer relationship with the Gleneden

Sanitary District Board. He also stated there's no other thing to do other than to try to get the best service they can from the sanitary facility, as there's no other place for their treatment to go.

VIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Relocate Recycling Drop Site

Owings said no new site had been identified, and he felt the west side of the wall by the harbor lift station was still the best option for a new location. There was discussion regarding whether the City is mandated to provide recycling containers; Murray said there's an ORS statute that says recycling must be available, but sites are not required within city limits for cities under 4,000 population. Most Councilors felt the harbor was a bad location because fish carcasses would end up in the recycle bins. Owings suggested either paving the parking lot as planned, and chip sealing it when it starts to break down in 2-3 years, or double-paving the parking lot so it will hold up to the weight of the containers and trucks. He also said North Lincoln Sanitary doesn't have smaller trucks or smaller containers. There was further discussion. Audience member Lars Robison suggested sending people to Lincoln City with their recyclable glass. Audience member Loren Goddard questioned the harbor parking lot's ability to handle the containers. A Councilor stated she wants public input before removing any containers, and another Councilor questioned whether City Ordinances require all parking lots to be paved; Murray responded that parking lots are only required to have a dust-free surface.

<u>Motion 3</u>: Leff moved to direct Staff to send out a Request For Proposal for paving the City Hall parking lot at the original plan of 2" of asphalt; and to eliminate the cardboard containers with proper public notice, i.e. on the website and in the newsletter; and keep the glass recycling container. Lewis seconded the motion.

Mayor Connors said it was moved and seconded, and called for discussion. There was none.

This allows people from outside the area to assist effectively during an emergency. The packets would cost around \$900 for Depoe Bay, but the State has a grant program to reimburse 50% of the purchase price.

<u>Motion 5</u>: Leff moved to approve an expense not to exceed \$500 to pay for emergency operations "Go Packets". Cameron seconded the motion.
