Correspondence –

P. Robison reviewed e-mails from Senators Merkley and Wyden regarding letter of support for the Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund.

Also reviewed were Terry Owings' letter to Lincoln County Board of Commissioners and a letter to Mr. Mattila regarding the: Temporary Suspension – Enforcement of Ordinance No. 252, Harbor Ordinance, Requirements.

Liaison Officer Report- None

Harbormaster's Report –

P. Robison reported that the finger piers were in, dock repairs were being completed and the harbor was ready for the summer season. P. Robison met with Army Corps of Engineers and a tide staff was installed on the west side of the harbor.

R. Davilla asked if the electric pedestals were ok for 30 amp. P. Robison replied that yes 30 amp service is available.

Unfinished Business –

- A. Spalling Seawall –  
Army Corps of Engineers took pictures of the seawall but no findings yet.
- B. Diesel Fuel –  
P. Robison believes the harbor is getting the low sulfur diesel.
- C. Dock 1 Finger Piers –  
P. Murray stated that six new finger piers are in the 2012-13 budget.
- D. Electrical Pedestals –  
P. Robison reported that he had no new information regarding the electric pedestals.

New Business –

M. Dowd stated that the Fleet of Flower was great.

Commissioner Concerns –

N. Achen stated that the parking at the harbor needs to be brought to City Council's attention. People are calling the police, moorage holders are being ticketed. The City needs to provide more parking for moorage holders.

M. Dowd stated that a lawyer could argue paying for services that they can't access is unlawful.

R. Davilla questioned basis of tickets/enforcement when there are no signs, no spaces designated.

N. Achen stated that there is a need for six to twelve reserved spaces for moorage holders.

P. Robison stated that the parking lot is deeded as "public parking".

R. Davilla stated that the fire department has of yet to establish fire lanes.

N. Achen reported that a moorage holder received a \$108.00 parking ticket and they are taking donations to help pay for it. Harbor Commission needs to take this matter to the City Council.

M. Dowd asked "what are the possible solutions to this problem?"

R. Davilla stated they should ask City Council to investigate basis of enforcement/ticketing.

MOTION: N. Achen recommends that this issue needs to be passed onto City Council, to designate parking spaces/reserved spaces for moorage holders.
