Chair Goddard called the meeting to order and established a quorum at 6:08 pm.

Approval of April 15, 2010 Regular Meeting Minutes

MOTION: O'Brien moved to approve the meeting minutes as written. Roberts seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion passed.

Goddard announced that a guest from OSU will be present at this evening's meeting to provide information on Humboldt squid. When she arrives, time will be provided for the presentation.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Otter Rock Pilot Marine Reserve Community Work Group (CWG) Meetings

O'Brien reported that nine persons were present at the meeting in Otter Rock on May 17<sup>th</sup>. The 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting in Newport on May 25<sup>th</sup> has been publicized, it will be at the Newport Visual Arts Center. Ed Barrilleaux, manager at Otter Crest, has offered a meeting room for CWG meetings once the groups are formed. Murray reported that 3 applications have been received.

Sarrika Attoe arrived and Goddard invited her to make her presentation. She is studying diet and the expanded range of Humboldt squid, previously not prevalent in Oregon waters (Sea Grant project). Their ever-increasing presence is of concern because of their voracious appetites, they eat everything. She is seeking information on where these squid are being seen and is looking for squid collectors to aide her research, starting in August. She hopes fishermen will be able to participate, collectors will need to catch the squid, cut them open, remove some of the stomach content, place the content in a vial and freeze the carcass. She left information flyers for distribution (copy attached to the original of these minutes), noting there is an online reporting forum.

Socio-Economic Study (Melissa Murphy, ODFW)

O'Brien reported that Murphy needs to meet with NSAT representatives next week to discuss the process for the socio-economic study. Goddard, Robison and O'Brien volunteered to set up a meeting with her. Cristen Don, ODFW, distributed a list of potential indicator species (copy attached to the original of these minutes), noting that Alix Laferriere, ODFW, needs feedback and suggested this be discussed at the next meeting. She added that the Otter Rock Pilot Marine Reserve Management Plan Project Intergovernmental Agreement (City and ODFW) is being finalized.

NEW BUSINESS:

Cascade Head Community Team (CHCT) Briefing Roberts reported that at the last CHCT meeting there was discussion on rules and regulations on ocean fisheries; ODFW provided ocean maps for review and it was noted that the southern boundary line is incorrect; Cristen Don said that the wrong map was provided at the meeting, the boundary line has been corrected and the new map has been sent out; the next CHCT meeting will be on June 8<sup>th</sup>, 5 – 9 pm, location to be announced. Robison encouraged attendance and participation at these meetings.

Member and Public Comments

Ray commented on the recent CWG recruitment meeting in Otter Rock, noting that the marine garden could present additional issues. Robison voiced his concern over the low attendance at the CWG recruitment meetings, suggesting additional advertisement. O'Brien said meeting announcements have been published and flyers have been posted, he hopes for greater attendance at the upcoming meeting in Newport. Roberts said that Newport crabbers and fishermen have provided public comment on the proposed Cascade Head marine reserve, it is good to host the meeting in Newport so they can attend.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:53 pm.
