            CALL MEETING TO ORDER
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     Connors called the meeting to order and established a quorum at 6:03 PM.
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     II.
            DISCUSSION: ZONING ORDINANCE REVIEW
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     Connors reminded everyone to speak clearly into the microphone. It was agreed to postpone discussion
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     on the (M-C) Marine Commercial Zone given this evening's Regular Meeting Agenda includes a request
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     for a Zone Change of 7 Tax Lots from M-C to C-1 (Item F. Case File: #1-ZC-PC-06) and to proceed
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     with the review of the C-1 Zone. The Commissioners talked about the extent of the Regular Meeting
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     Agenda and the possibility of having to schedule a Special Meeting in order to complete the Agenda
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     Items. Lewis reiterated the three basic Sections in each Zone (Permitted Uses, Conditional Uses, and

     Standards) and stressed the importance of making the amendments easy to understand.
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     Commissioners discussed the following amendments to the DBZO Page 42. Section 3.110 Retail
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     Commercial Zone (C-1), Item 1. Revise b. to Manufactured Dwelling, Pre-Fabricated or Modular
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     Dwelling; f. Pre-Fabricated or Modular Dwelling; move d. Agricultural use of land provided that no
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     livestock shall be raised or kept on the premises to Item 2. Conditional Uses Permitted.
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     Commission directed Lewis to research how they could prevent a Porn Shop and/or related uses in
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     Depoe Bay. The Commission agreed to address the Parking Requirements at the next Workshop. A
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     Commissioner suggested they take note of the parking situation on July 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup>.
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     asked Staff to distribute a copy of a Parking Survey (included Street Parking from Evans St. to Lane St.
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     and Off-Street Parking both Private and Public) prepared for the Planning Commission during the
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     previous DBZO review. Terry Owings, City Superintendent, stated the data was also implemented in the
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     Downtown Refinement Plan Grant Application. Lewis shared the results from a Parking Survey
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     (completed on a Saturday in August) for the City of Waldport which indicated the average occupancy

     was 24% (perception was there was a shortage of spaces). Owings announced to the Commission the
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     termination of the Parking Lot Lease between the City of Depoe Bay and Gracie Strom (property sold).
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     The Commissioners conversed about the Public's parking habits. Owings explained the process the City
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     endured to have the current Parking Signs and how to request signage from O.D.O.T.
