

City of Depoe Bay- Gleneden Sanitary District Wastewater Advisory Committee
Regular Meeting – Monday, October 7, 2013 – 4:00 PM
Depoe Bay City Hall

The meeting began at 4:08 PM.

Operations Report, Bio Solids Hauling Snyder reported the Sanitary District has cleaned the sewer line from Lancer St. to Fogarty Creek, along the highway. This is done every five years as a preventative maintenance measure. The Water District is replacing the water line on Lincoln Ave., which is the oldest part of the water system. Sewer lines along Lincoln Ave. are fine, no work is needed. He explained that the GSD sewer collection system begins just north of the Crystal Wizard and runs to Fogarty Creek Park. The airport is not in the GSD sewer system, Wells St. is, Kernville is on septic systems, Salishan has its own treatment with the spit being on sand filter systems. They experienced no problems during the recent heavy rains.

Walls reported the recent heavy rains were a non-event at the treatment plant. There was 265,000 gallons of sludge hauled during the last haul, which is approximately 50,000 gallons less than normal. The next haul will be in the spring. He reported that DEQ has officially revised the NPDES permit from a level 3 back to level 2. Brady Weidner is now the designated responsible person at the Treatment Plant. He is certified as Level 2 Operator, and is responsible for paperwork. Erickson asked when Walls is leaving the employ of the city. Walls does not have a definite date, but it could be next fall, depending on his wife's progress. Walls also reported that Dan Arnold is thinking of retiring sometime next year.

Discussion ensued on the subject of cleaning and tv-ing the main line from manhole 16 to the Vista Lift Station. Baines said this is part of the shared facilities (cost shared) and the work should be done. It is estimated the cleaning and tv-ing for the line will be \$8,000 to \$10,000, plus repair expenses for any problems found. Point repairs cost around \$2,000/point for "in place" pipe repairs v. excavation and line replacement which is much more costly. Mattila and Baines said that this work should be done this year. Bids could be obtained in the spring to schedule the cleaning and tv-ing for April – early June.

Boring 10" Pressure Sewer Main (Vista Pump Station to east side of Highway 101)
There was no discussion on this agenda item.

There being no further business, the meeting ended at 4:48 pm.
